## Use website data in Can I Use

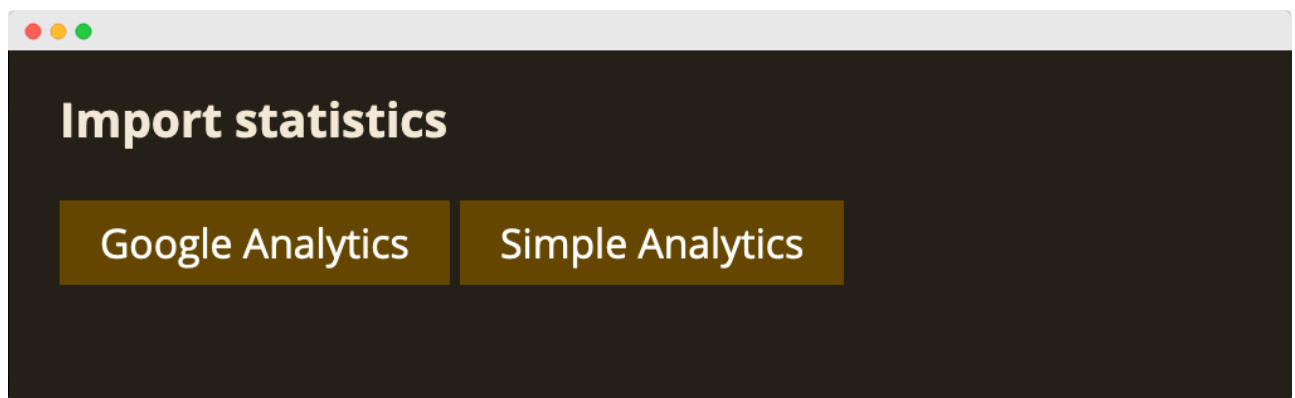
If you were a developer you know the website caniuse.com. Can I use provides up-to-date browser support tables for support of front-end web technologies on desktop and mobile web browsers. It's super useful when you develop features for your visitors.

Can I use shows percentages of support of features you can use in the browser. Let's say you develop a new feature and you want to know how many of your visitors support Flexbox. You would [search for Flexbox](#) and find out the percentage of visitors around the world who support Flexbox. But, this does not say much about **your** visitors.

That's where the Simple Analytics integrations comes in. Want to try it?


First you need to export your website data:

1. Replace `example.com` with your website name in this URL:  
`https://simpleanalytics.com/example.com.json?version=1`
2. Go to that URL
3. Save the output as a .json file, `caniuse.json` for example
4. Go to [caniuse.com/ciu/import](#)
5. You will see this screen:



6. Click "Simple Analytics"

7. Select the json file:


